**PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS**

**FAMILY IDEAS**

At Mass, the short prayer over the offerings that the priest says is different each Sunday. This prayer ends when the priest says, “Through Christ our Lord.” We respond “Amen”. And make the prayer our own. Prayer connects us to our God. Prayer is part of who we are and who we are called to be.

Stress to your children that there are many ways to pray to God after we leave Mass. We can pray in the

morning and at night, in our own words or with traditional prayers, when we are happy, sad, or afraid. We can pray by ourselves or with our family.

Pray with your children when you tuck them in at night. This helps them become people of prayer who praise God and ask God’s help in their lives. Prayer is an important part of our relationship with God. Teach your children not only traditional prayers, but also how to pray in their own words.

**A CALL TO HOLINESS BY POPE FRANCIS.**

43. It is not easy to grasp the truth that we have received from the Lord. And it is even more difficult to express it. So we cannot claim that our way of understanding this truth authorizes us to exercise a strict supervision over others’ lives. Here I would note that in the Church there

legitimately coexist different ways of interpreting many aspects of doctrine and Christian life; in their variety, they “help to express more clearly the immense riches of God’s word”. It is true that “for those who long for a monolithic body of doctrine guarded by all and leaving no room for nuance, this might appear as undesirable and leading to confusion”.<sup>[39]</sup> Indeed, some currents of gnosticism scorned the concrete simplicity of the Gospel and attempted to replace the trinitarian and incarnate God with a superior Unity, wherein the rich diversity of our history disappeared.

44. In effect, doctrine, or better, our understanding and expression of it, “is not a closed system, devoid of the dynamic capacity to pose questions, doubts, inquiries... The questions of our people, their suffering, their struggles, their dreams, their trials and their worries, all possess an interpretational value that we cannot ignore if we want to take the principle of the incarnation seriously. Their wondering helps us to wonder, their questions question us”.<sup>[40]</sup>



#### **UN LLAMADO A LA SANTIDAD DEL PAPA FRANCISCO.**

43. Nosotros llegamos a comprender muy pobremente la verdad que recibimos del Señor. Con mayor dificultad todavía logramos expresarla. Por ello no podemos pretender que nuestro modo de entenderla nos autorice a ejercer una supervisión estricta de la vida de los demás. Quiero recordar que en la Iglesia conviven lícitamente distintas maneras de interpretar muchos aspectos de la doctrina y de la vida cristiana que, en su variedad, «ayudan a explicitar mejor el riquísimo tesoro de la Palabra». Es verdad que «a quienes sueñan con una doctrina monolítica defendida por todos sin matices, esto puede parecerles una imperfecta dispersión»<sup>[39]</sup>. Precisamente, algunas corrientes gnósticas despreciaron la sencillez tan concreta del Evangelio e intentaron reemplazar al Dios trinitario y encarnado por una Unidad superior donde desaparecía la rica multiplicidad de nuestra historia.

44. En realidad, la doctrina, o mejor, nuestra comprensión y expresión de ella, «no es un sistema cerrado, privado de dinámicas capaces de generar interrogantes, dudas, cuestionamientos», y «las preguntas de nuestro pueblo, sus angustias, sus peleas, sus sueños, sus luchas, sus preocupaciones, poseen valor hermenéutico que no podemos ignorar si queremos tomar en serio el principio de encarnación. Sus preguntas nos ayudan a preguntarnos, sus cuestionamientos nos cuestionan»<sup>[40]</sup>.
