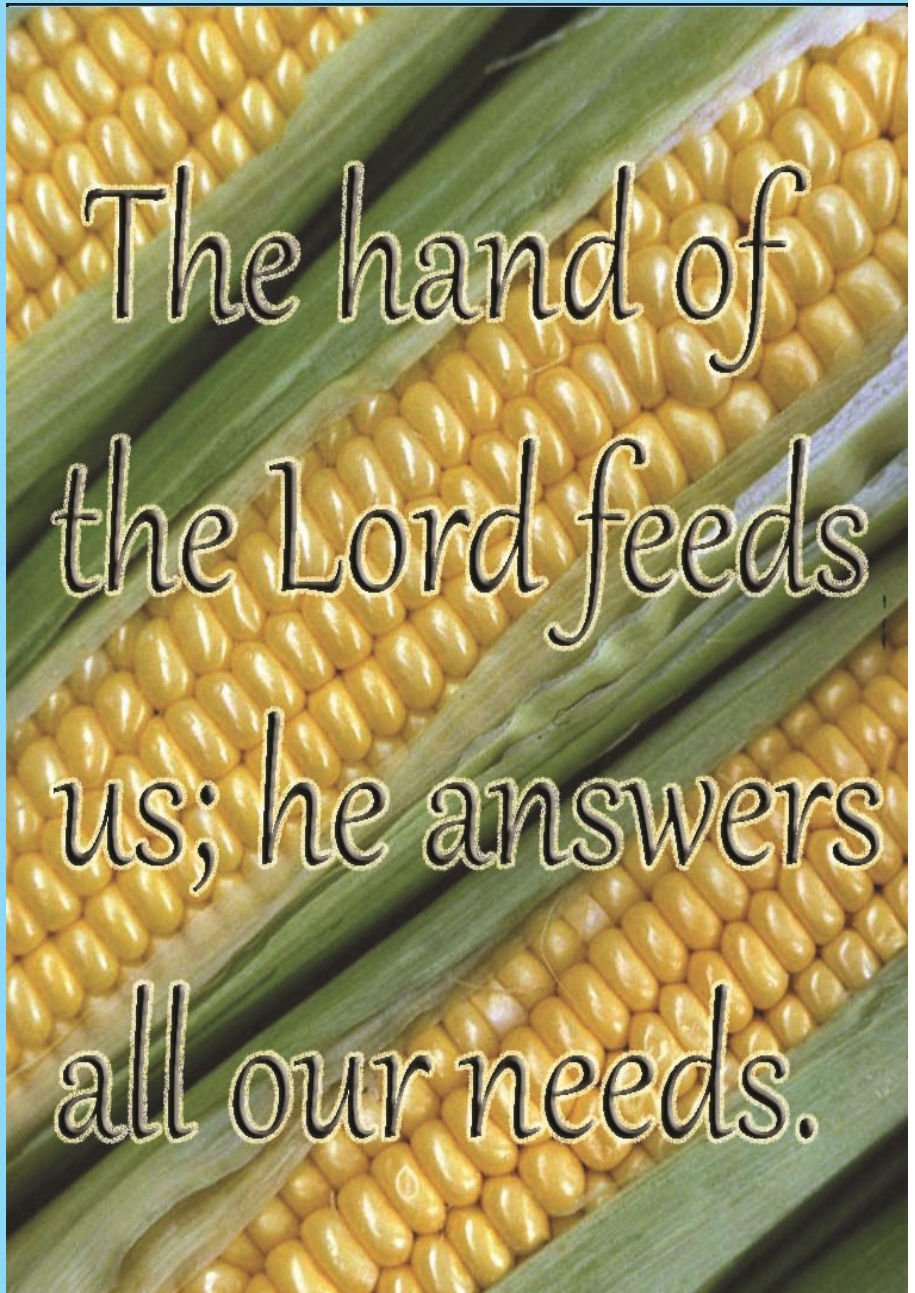
INFANT BAPTISM: Parents must be registered and regularly attending the Sunday Eucharist to begin Baptism preparation. Baptismal Preparation is held by appointment. Call the parish office to schedule a date. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sunday of every month.

MARRIAGE: If one of the engaged couple (or their parents) is registered at St. Mary's arrangements may be made personally by the couple at least six months in advance. 8-10 months is preferred.

SICK CALLS: We are happy to visit the sick and bring Communion to them. Please notify the parish office.

ANNULMENT PROCESS: If you are contemplating filing for an annulment; know that it is a healing process. It takes up to 18 months for the Tribunal to complete each case, so please take that into consideration. Call the parish office for more information.

FROM THE PASTOR

The Miracle of the five loaves and two fish, (John 6:1-15).

Sharing of a meal with family or friends is always a delight! It encourages solidarity, sharing, even love and hospitality. Today's Scripture readings bring about the oracle of the Lord of how he cares about all His people. The First Reading from 2 Kings 4:42-44; the Lord instructed His prophet to feed His people with grain of the finest wheat. They were eating and satisfying and there were left overs.

In addition, today's holy Gospel from John, Jesus' feed the multitude of people with five loaves and two fish. John's holy Gospel of five loaves and two fish makes the multiplication story eucharistic. Jesus was on a mountain and the crowd followed Him there. The apostles Philip and Andrew complemented each other. Philip figured out the whole situation. Andrew dived in the task against all odds, he pointed the boy with five loaves and two fish to Jesus. In this boy's lunch, Jesus found the materials for the sign.

Jesus will always provide and supply whatever we have to offer that may not be much. If we offer the little we have in the ministry and the service of Christ, there is no doubt Jesus will accomplish the impossible through us. There is no shame because we do not have more, but there is no reason for failing to offer what we have to our loving God who knows what we need.

Yes, the response we need to obtain at all times is from the Second letter of Saint Paul to the Christian community of Ephesus. "Humility, gentleness, patience, love, striving and persevering in unity of the spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit," (Ephesians 4:1-6). The hope of our calling is from Jesus Christ as Saint Paul states because our baptism of one faith, one Lord one God and He is our Father that all things are directed to and for His honor, praise, and glory.

Therefore, whenever we gather together in solidarity around the Eucharistic table of the Lord, we share together in the heavenly meal prepares in His sacrificial love for you and I. He cares and loves to each and everyone of us, and He will always provide in whatever is lacking in us. All we need is to be faithful and depend and rely on Him. Saturday, August 11th (9-11 am)

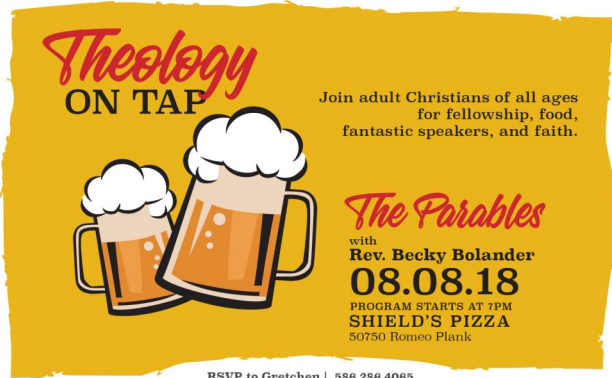
